Assembly instructions

Difficulty level: Intermediate

Completion Time 13 - 17 hours

NECESSARY TOOLS

B&W Printer



Scissors or a cutter

Hole Puncher (We recommend 2 - 2.4 mm sized holes for this build)



Approx 9,5 square feet of leather. (We recommend 6-7oz leather for this build)



Thread and needles (We recommend 1.2 mm waxed thread for this build)



6 x 22 mm D rings


2 x 25 mm buckles ---> https://goo.gl/AEyRfj

2 x 20 mm buckles ---> https://goo.gl/Ynzxvr

A few rivets

PRINTING THE PATTERN

Set up your paper size to A4 and choose actual size in the printer settings



Alternatively you can use "letter" format which is approximately the same size and will not impact the size of the product significantly

Print all the patterns. Take note that some of the larger parts are spread over two or even four pages. Use the second page of the pattern as an assembly guide.

Even though the dimensions are different this backpack and the bag in the video have similar pieces and the constructing process is the same

The only difference is the additional straps attached to the back piece.



Attach these as shown in the pictures below BEFORE stitching into place the inside pocket

Start with the D ring holders at the top







There are also two D rings straps at the bottom of the piece.







Once finished you will have the back piece ready to hold the back straps



For the back straps I propose a simple design as shown in the pictures below. Feel free to cut the straps as long or as short as you need to fit you.
